

Pastor's Corner

Did you know that Double Entry Bookkeeping, the basis of all accounting everywhere in the world, was invented by a 15th century monk? That was the first thing I learn in my Accounting classes at UT. Further, I have always asserted that Double Entry Bookkeeping could only have been invented by a monk.

Until I just googled it, that is what I believed. But, maybe, my facts were not completely accurate. It seems debits and credits have been around since as early as the 1100's and a Croatian published a little something on the topic in 1458. But it is the Franciscan monk, Luca Pacioli, whose descriptive writings were published in 1494 who is known as the Father of Modern Accounting. Perhaps it was the illustrations by Leonardo da Vinci in his book that gave his work the edge.

And the reason I have always said double entry bookkeeping could only have been invented by a monk is because one of the hardest things for people to understand about accounting for an entity is that nothing belongs to the entity. Everything on the Balance Sheet, every asset that is a part of the business belongs to someone else. And, whether that someone is the owner or a creditor, it is someone or something outside of the business.

For a monk this would be easier to understand because the monk knows that nothing, he has, belongs to him. Everything belongs to God and is only his to use for the time being. Like we say in one of our hymns, "We give thee but thine own, what e'er the gift may be; all that we have is thine alone, a trust, O Lord, from thee."

QuickBooks is based on old fashion double entry bookkeeping. But, in its attempt to make it "user" friendly, some of the things that have made double entry such a good system have been changed. The QuickBooks system is not fatally flawed but, in the "quickness" of establishing a set of books some of the inherent checks and balances of the old fashion, not-so-quick books, can easily be by-passed.

Some options offered to the keeper of the books look so reasonable that the bookkeeper naturally uses them. And, Bingo, the QuickBooks are in a mess quicker than you can bat your eye.

Without looking at the books with an “old fashion” double entry eye, one may not notice the problem. Because, the bills are properly paid, wages and payroll taxes and deductions are all accounted for properly on reports generated by QuickBooks. And everyone’s donations are recorded and accounted for in exactly the way the donor wanted them done. And the payments are made and not made to the charities designated. And the Auditors every year have checked this all out—and all is well.

The debits and credits of the old-fashioned double entry bookkeeping are still there. But, somehow making things “user friendly” doesn’t always keep everything in balance.

I was wondering if we do that in our lives and in our communities and in our churches—sometimes in our attempts to make things more modern or “user” friendly something gets overlooked. Maybe we can think about that and talk about it sometime.



Plastic boxes to pack for Operation Christmas Child are being handed out after Sunday church services. Some will be left in the office for pick up. The boxes are free of charge. Please pick one up and fill it!

Take Action to Help Our Persecuted Family

Our persecuted brothers and sisters are asking for more Action Packs.

Each Action Pack includes a variety of practical items for persecuted Christians in need: a pair of sandals for a barefoot Sudanese woman; a T-shirt for a displaced Iraqi Christian child who has little clothing; a warm jacket for the child of a Pakistani brick-kiln worker. When they receive Action Packs, our persecuted family members are reminded that Christians in the United States have not forgotten them.

VOM has shipped more than 8,000 Action Packs in the last 12 months, and our international staff are asking for more. When you order an Action Pack, The Voice of the Martyrs will send you a special pre-printed bag to be filled with items you select from a list included with your pack. After you pack the bag, you will ship your Action Pack back to The Voice of the Martyrs, and VOM contacts will then distribute your Action Pack along with a Bible or gospel story book.

Examples of the types of items sponsors place in Action Packs:

blanket • jacket or windbreaker • light sweater • socks • solid-color T-shirt • bed sheet • towel • bar of soap • sponge or foam ball • family photo and note or drawing (*optional, but appreciated by our persecuted Christian family members*)

A pair of sandals for a barefoot Sudanese woman. A T-shirt for an Iraqi refugee child who has been wearing the same worn clothing day after day. Warm jackets for the children of Pakistani laborers. These are the gifts of love provided in VOM Action Packs.

VOM has shipped thousands of Action Packs to persecuted believers, and yet the need is far greater than we are fulfilling. Put your love in action by giving the gift of Action Packs.

Each Action Pack is filled with daily necessities like soap, blankets, bed sheets and clothes. With each pack, we also include a Bible. The Voice of the Martyrs is currently distributing Action Packs in countries where Christians lack basic necessities and where they suffer for their faith in Christ.

Action Packs You Fill the Pack \$7 Each:

When you choose to fill an Action Pack, VOM will send you an Action Pack kit that includes large plastic bag and a list of items that would be appropriate to put in the bag. Once you have filled the bag, mail it back to VOM. VOM will then ship your Action Pack to the field, where it will be given to a Christian family.

When you choose to have VOM fill the Action Pack, we will purchase the daily essentials (including perishables and other items that cannot be shipped from the U.S.), fill the bag and then distribute it in the country where it's needed most.


