Christ the King Sunday, marked the end of our church year. The first Sunday after Thanksgiving we begin the New Year with the Advent Season which consists of four Sundays. Right after Thanksgiving, we set focus on Christmas, but what primarily is our focus? Could it be for some to just get Christmas over and done with so we can get on with our normal lives?

Let's hope for the majority of us, it is a time of anticipation....of waiting....of looking....of hoping. But it's really more than a young girl having a baby in a stable. It's about the promise God made to us to bring us <u>life and salvation through the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ</u>.

Are we also like the Jews of Jesus time and looking for Jesus to come and bring life to a dying world? We look for the birth of this new life and remember that all things are new in Jesus Christ. We also look for his continual presence through the Bible and Communion, and his eventual return to judge the living and the dead.

A visible sign of Advent is the Advent wreath which consists of evergreen branches encircling four candles.

At Salem, as candles are lit, the hymn "Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah" is sung beginning with the first verse and adding a verse each Sunday. What does this represent? I would say the Advent wreath represents to us the eternal live that Christ Jesus gives to those who believe.

As Christians, we believe that Christ is not only a part of a past event, but a very real life in the present and the future. Advent is a time to reflect on what life means to us in our very own hearts. As we do this, we may also be extra observant of all that is around us. It is suggested that each one of us look around for other visible signs and sharing them with each other and others we know. Each week we will have a focus word to guide us.

- Ø Week one beginning on December 2-Focus word is <u>STIR</u>. Look for signs that God is stirring things up.
- Ø Week two beginning on December 9-Focus word is <u>HOPE</u>. Look for things that are hopeful.
- Ø Week three beginning on December 16-Focus word is <u>ADVENT</u>. Look for things that announce the advent of God.
- Ø Week four beginning on December 23-Focus word is <u>REPENT</u>.






