Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

At the end of this week I will finish my third term as the Bishop of the Southwestern Texas Synod. As I pondered a Scripture passage that might encapsulate my feelings, I settled on Ephesians 3:20-21: "Now to God, who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

It has been an honor to serve these eighteen years. It has been filled with blessings and heartaches, joys and sorrows. I have blessed to experience the width and depth of this church, visiting all the ministries in our synod, as well as the churchwide office on many occasions, all eight seminaries, other synods, our Companion Synod - The Lutheran Church in Costa Rica, and Lutheran partners around the world. The good far outweighs any difficult times.

I thank my wife, Debbie, and our children, Daniel and Rebecca, who were 15 and 11 when I was first elected, for their continued support and patience with my busy schedule and being away from home so often. Also, Debbie and I thank you for your generous gifts to the Tiemann Endowment for Leadership Development. The synod's leaders will be truly blessed with over \$60,000 in that fund already, and we pray that this will be a continual blessing to all types of leaders in our synod.

I especially thank our pastors and deacons, lay leaders and youth ministers, Deans and Synod Council, synod officers and synod staff, Lutheran social ministry organizations and agencies, colleagues in the ELCA Conference of Bishops and churchwide offices, and ecumenical and interfaith partners. We have worked together to "accomplish abundantly far more (together) than all we can ask or imagine."

I plan to "take a deep breath" until the end of the year with just some supply preaching, home projects, and relaxation, but when you see me in the future, call me "Pastor." The title of "Bishop" now belongs to Pr. Sue Briner, and I will remember her as my Bishop in my daily prayers. She has many gifts that will serve this synod well, and I ask you to support her in that important calling as you supported me.

But I will stay on at Ephesus until Pentecost, because a great door for effective work has openedto me, and there are many who oppose me. 1 Corinthians 16:8-9

Open Doors of Opportunity

The Apostle Paul was always focused on opportunity. Yet he was a realist who knew the opposition he faced from the enemy of our souls. He expresses here an interest in visiting the Corinthian Church for a significant period of time. But it would not be until after Pentecost because of great open doors for effective work in spite of much opposition. In doing kingdom work we should always expect opposition but that should not blind us to the great opportunities.

A young pastor in the southern Philippines who attended a Standing Strong Through the Storm (SSTS) seminar, shares his personal experiences with this principle:"

The SSTS taught me a lot of things. First, it taught me to stand firm in the Lord during tough times. Second, it taught me to establish my relationship with God and not to focus on difficulties. Third, it taught me to lead my whole family to serve and obey God even though hardship and persecution come. And also it taught me to continue on with the ministry, even if others abandon us.

"My wife and I were newlyweds and fresh graduates of a Bible school when God called us to start a work among the Muslims. We were afraid of them and did not know how to minister to them. Open Doors gave us books on how to love the Muslims. In one community we started literacy classes among the children.

"But the more we grew in our desire to obey God, the more our faith was tested. In 2004, I was diagnosed with stage-four pancreatic cancer. But my sickness did not stop the Lord in accomplishing His purpose for our lives. In 2008, He led us to permanently settle in a place where most Christians dared not go. As we obeyed God, we experienced His great power—that same year, my doctor told me that I was cancer free!

"The Lord also paved the way for us to reach one Muslim tribe through an adult literacy project. We built relationships with our students and eventually shared the gospel with them. We seized every opportunity to help them with their needs, more so with their relationship with Jesus Christ." I would say that the biggest test of our faith was not when I got sick, but when our sending church abandoned us and cut our support. I felt alone, but God sustained me and my family.

"The Lord is continuously opening more opportunities for us to minister to our Muslim brothers. Right now, with Open Doors' help, we are holding literacy classes among the three Muslim tribes in our area. We are also distributing the *JESUS* film when there is any opportunity to do so."

STANDING STRONG THROUGH THE STORM June 6 Memorizing God's Word

When China's best-known pastor, Wang Ming-dao, was finally released from prison, he stated, "In these past twenty years, I have not had a copy of the Bible. Happily between the ages of twenty-one to twenty-four, I spent my time at home doing the housework and studying the Scriptures. I memorized many passages. These passages in my heart came out one by one and strengthened me. Had it not been for those words of God, then not only I, but many others, would also have been defeated."

Pastor Lamb in southern China was in prison for many years at that same time. "I understood then why I had memorized so much of God's Word while in Bible school," he says. "I kept my sanity only by repeating Bible verses over and over."

The best way the church can prepare for trials and persecution is by seriously studying and learning the Word of God. Christians need an overview of the whole Bible. Understanding God's outline for mankind in the Bible aids in memorization as well.

What is the right attitude to bring to Bible study? Some read and study the Bible with the intent to get something from it to teach to others. But first, we should approach the Bible with the desire to see the goodness and loving-kindness of God and understand how "wide and long and high and deep" is His love for us (Ephesians 3:17-19). Let His love show you His supply for your own need and then you are better able to meet the needs of others.

Second, approach the Bible with humility. Study the Bible to discover what God has said. Bible study is meant not merely to inform but to transform.

In restricted countries where Bibles are in short supply, pastors are often in a quandary as to which of the many spiritually needy he should share these precious books with. Progress in Bible memorization is one method they can use for determining who will receive the available Bibles. One house church group in Vietnam decided to give them to the believers who were most determined to use them. The criterion used was memory work. So Bibles were shared only with those who recited flawlessly Psalm 119—all 176 verses!




