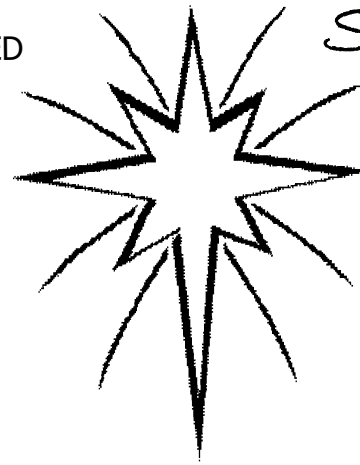

Pastor's Corner

So! did you know which one of the Fruits of the Spirit I left out last month? Had to look it up, but figured it out. It was *Gentleness*. That surprised me, but maybe it should not. For a very long time I always left out self-control. The other Fruits of the Spirit have such a nice soft, poetical sound than the list ends with the loud, matter-of-fact: Self-Control. But, over the years I have learned that it is indeed one of the Fruits of the Spirit even if it sounds more like something out of a military academy than out of a Sunday School lesson.

This time I left out *gentleness*. The first things that come to mind are the taming of an animal or the quieting of a show animal at the live stock show while you are waiting for your turn with the judges. Way back when we were all in high school, a friend and his brother went to all the shows. And Bobbie was older and got his pick of the animals to show. But, Larry, my friend, always beat him—no matter which animal. Larry had a way with animals that his brother did not. And I think that way that he had is the essences of *gentleness*.

When I started looking up exactly what is gentleness—besides a lighthanded touch on the gas pedal, or being short and not having a booming voice, I discovered that maybe I am not a *gentle* person after all. In Proverbs we read: *A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.* Pr. 5:4 And, again: *A gentle tongue's a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit.* Pr. 15:4 And in the 4th chapter of Philippians Paul tells us “*let your gentleness be known to all*”. How does one determine if they are “*gentle*” enough?

Well, the story of the yellow cat comes to mind. Someone convinced me to take in a yellow stray cat. Now, usually cats just appear and disappear and I put out food and water while they are around. But this one was different, I had accepted some level of responsibility for this particular cat. And, immediately after I took it in, it started losing hair and looking bad. So, I got a carrier to take the cat to the Vet. But was not sure how I would get the dumb cat into the crate. By the way, at the Vet's office, they refused to accept Dumb Cat as the cat's name, but the cat knew what its name was.

In the 15 years I have lived here, I have had one salesman at my door— the day the cat needed to go to the Vet. It was a young man selling insurance and I was a little short with him as I had to get to the Vet place by a certain time. I don't remember how it came about, but I agreed to listen to his spiel if he would help me get the cat into the carrier. And he did, but he also made it conditional that I would be nicer to the next person to come to my door.

And the moral of the story is: When you start digging around in your roots during Lent, you may be a little surprised at what shows up.

May your Lenten disciplines shed light where it is needed. And, in the words of Martin Luther, may we all become a little more like Christ to our neighbors and the stranger at the door. And, if I am not Christlike, may I at least be a little nicer.

It is time for some spring cleaning around the church.

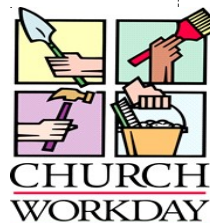
We would like to:

Salem Lutheran Church Council Minutes Meeting March 4, 2019

Attendees: All council Members were present along with transitional Pastor Sharon Wiggins.

Devotional-Pastor Wiggins – Read and discussed Luke 13 verse 6. Joel volunteered to do the devotional next month.

Prayer Concerns – Joyce Shafer was moved to Warm Springs; Connie Hurt at Citizen's in Victoria; caregivers for dementia and Alzheimer's patients; Pastor Wiggins' face pain; continued prayers for Mark and Lauren Howell

Approval of Minutes from previous meeting – Joel 1st Lindy 2nd

Reports:

Treasurer-Since meeting took place a week earlier than usual it was too early to have completed February numbers.

Pastor – Pastor Wiggins requested feedback from the previous Sunday's brunch/festival and how the council will move forward in our search for a new pastor.

Proclaim – Altar Guild is ready for the Lenten Season. A training is being scheduled for the new acolytes.

Nurture – Carol Herald-speed at Trinity Lutheran in Victoria is trying to organize a monthly event for 6-12th graders.

Response – Pastor Wiggins will be helping us with witness and discipleship classes. The classes will help us learning to tell our personal faith story and witness to others.

Property – Work has begun on installation of LED lights in the education building. We will also replace the fluorescent lights in the choir loft and sacristy. The wooden fence at the courtyard has been removed and replaced with iron fencing.

Old Business – The call committee got some really good information to work with from the meeting this past Sunday. They are having their first meeting March 6, 2019. 2019 Council person schedule is made and Terri will be sending it out this week.

New Business – Designated “The Quilt Angels” to receive all Lent offerings. Cathy 1st Lindy 2nd Designated “Pregnancy Help Center” to receive all Advent offerings. Cathy 1st Lindy 2nd

Steve Bales presented the suggestions from the Endowment Fund committee on the one-time distribution of \$1600. The committee recommended \$500 for the bible translators, \$600 for the ELCJHL (schools in the Holy Land), and \$500 World Relief – greenhouses in Syria and Lebanon. The recommendations were accepted. Retha 1st Lindy 2nd. Pam and Steve Bales will be unable to attend the synod assembly. We will be looking for two other delegates.

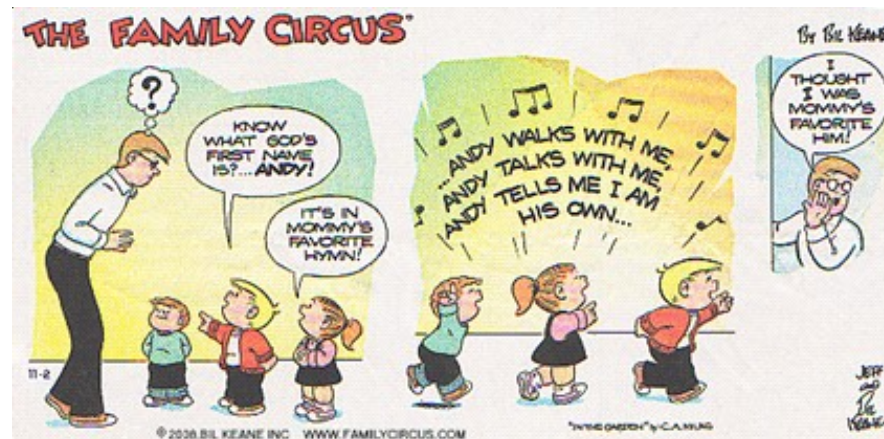


Quilt Angels

If you would like to join them, they meet every Tuesday morning at 9:00AM at the 1st United Methodist Church or if you would like more information, Doris Mills is a member.



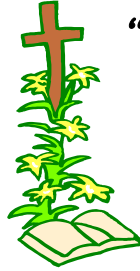

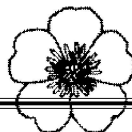
Hosanna!
