## Pastor's Corner

#### Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

This is the day the Lorde has made! Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

These words resounded in Salem Lutheran Church on Easter morning. The Ark that is our Sanctuary rose so high I think it was probably hovering over the water like the voice of God on the first day of creation. We knew, we knew for sure, that the temple curtain had been torn in two—from the top to the bottom—Christ had risen indeed, we were in the presence of the Living God, and the Holy Spirit was filling our hearts. What a beautiful thing it is to be with your brothers and sisters on an Easter morning singing alleluias, cracking confetti eggs, and filling the place with showers of blessings.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Easter is so special that we celebrate for a whole week of Sundays—all the way to Pentecost. And be sure and mark your calendar for that date which this year falls on June 9<sup>th</sup>. I have been hearing rumors about something very special happening on that Sunday and I know you will not want to miss it. But before I get ahead of myself here.

Holy Week and Easter—what just happened? What did Jesus do *TO* us when he got up, took off his cloak, put a towel around his waist, filled the basin with water and started washing the feet of his disciples? We tend to talk a lot more about what Jesus did *FOR* us than what he did *TO* us during Holy Week and Easter.

We all know what he did *FOR* us—he died *FOR* our sins, paid the price FOR us, a price we could not pay ourselves. He died FOR us so that we might live. We spend a lot of time talking or thinking about something called atonement and exactly what that might mean.

It is a big theological word that covers many ideas and theories. I am not sure what it means. Other than, that I do not need to worry about not being adequate to earn God's favor—I do not have to do anything like that. Because, whatever I might want to call it, it has already been taken care of. It is covered by God's grace.

On the Cross, God's love and grace came down to earth, and it flowed through the out stretched arms of Jesus as he hung there. It flowed out to each and everyone of us. And, as we said on Easter Sunday, when we deny our self, take up our cross and follow Jesus all the way through Holy Week and into the resurrection, we get up on that cross and we look at the world the way God looks at the creation and it is good, it is very good.

From that vantage point, with our arms outstretched, facing the world, right there where the vertical transcendence and the horizontal immanence of God come together, our heart meets the heart of God. And, there, we know what he has done *TO* us.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

**Prayer and Concerns** – Gabrielle Rodriquez, 19 year-old daughter of the gentleman who did all of our new concrete work here at Salem, diagnosed with thyroid cancer and heart issues.

# **Approval of Minutes from previous meeting** – Lindy 1st Retha 2<sup>nd</sup> **Reports:**

**Treasurer**-\$9000 in the black! All expenses are about the same. Cathy and interim Pastor Wiggins (also a CPA) plan to sit down together and organize the books.

**Pastor** – Pre-assembly meeting coming up in May. Synod assembly meeting this year has a lot of changes in store for those who are in attendance.

**Proclaim** – Clarice was not able to attend this meeting.

**Nurture** – Interim Pastor Wiggins is going to lead the book of Revelations in Adult Sunday school. We have several potential 6<sup>th</sup> graders next year for the proposed monthly event at Trinity Lutheran in Victoria. There was much discussion about confirmation for the kids. It was decided to do it next year when we will have a larger group of students old enough to participate.

**Response** – June 9<sup>th</sup> is Pentecost Sunday and Wanda is trying to get all to wear red that day and possibly have a big Pot Luck lunch.

**Property** – The steps from the walkway to the parking lot are being replaced. An ADA ramp will be placed on one side with steps on the other. New handrails will be installed on each side going all the way to the brick columns and in the center just between the steps and ramp.

We will be assessing each of our four buildings to determine the best place to shelter during violent weather, i.e. tornadoes, etc. This information will then be shared and clearly posted.

We still have a leak from the church steeple. Will attempt to get it stopped prior to hurricane season. We are still waiting on a bid for new gutters.

Work continues on installation of LED lights in the education building. We will also replace the fluorescent lights in the choir loft and sacristy.

**Old Business** – The Call Process committee had its first meeting and it went really well.

New Business – The delegates elected by the Congregation will not be able to attend. The Council is calling a Congregational Meeting for April 28th to either: 1. Elect two other delegates, 2. Give the Council permission to appoint two delegates to the synod assembly.

# STANDING STRONG THROUGH THE STORM Religious Freedom

(This is an excerpt from *Open Doors* dated April 23, 2019)

Ron Boyd-MacMillian concludes his two-part analysis of religious freedom in our country:

It was a persecuted Christian in the Middle East who gave me the eyes to see that religious freedom always needs protecting, wherever one is.

"Freedom is fragile," she said. "Religious freedom is not about having the right laws to protect belief—that's a myth put out by the human rights community. No, religious freedom is protected not by laws, but by a climate of respect and openness that ensures the laws are correctly applied. A toleration law, for example, can be used for or against Christians. Christians always have to fight to ensure the climate is tolerant."

She added, "I don't care what country or state you live in; you also live in a culture that hates Christ. That's your fight, and every Christian on the earth has the same fight, whether you belong to a so-called Christian society or not."

She was right. A climate of prejudice against Christians has crept up by stealth in Western cultures, even in apparently Christian ones. We are in a battle in our own backyard. Thank you, Persecuted Church, for awakening me to the fight!

As Ron writes, we are in a battle even at home. It doesn't take much insight—or even imagination—to assess the direction of the moral slide in our free societies, especially in the Western world. Biblical values are disappearing and secular philosophies with a pseudo-biblical aura are fast taking their place.

As I've travelled and spoken in Western countries, it is not uncommon to have folk share with me how they lost their employment because of their faith. They had not been obnoxious nor spending company time witnessing. They had simply expressed their support for biblical principles that were being violated. Jesus warns in our Scripture today that this treatment is because of His name. Let's make sure that it is not because we refuse to be His salt and light.
