



Pastor's Corner

The "motto" for our Synod is: God's grace transforms and connects us to learn, to love, to lead. These three things are very interrelated, but this year the Assembly emphasis was on learning. In the following years it will be on loving and leading. I am excited to see each of these.

The Assembly theme was *Open Eyes Burning Hearts*, based on the Walk to Emmaus story. There were five talks by the keynote speaker, Peggy Hahn, on the topic *Sacred Shifts*. She used the following diagram for the base of her talks:



The times in which we live and the places in which we find ourselves come together with our traditions and our visions to create a Window of Opportunity; or, to create a Perfect Storm of Chaos. In layman's terms that I understand a little better: *Change is inevitable, how we respond to it varies and our response greatly influences the outcome*. And she was there to help us shape the outcome. Now whether or not we agreed with her was another thing.

She told a story about a caterpillar going into the cocoon phase and emerging as a butterfly. We had been working on fear of change making it hard to recognize change as a window of opportunity and not a destructive thing. The questions that came to mind were: Does the caterpillar experience fear as it turns upside down on a twig and starts forming the cocoon? Does it know it is about to cease to exist when it starts the cocoon? Does it hurt when everything in it turns into something else? Sometimes it feels this way in the church, that everything is turning upside down, that nothing will ever be the same. I have no idea how a caterpillar might feel about the dramatic changes in his life. But I know that sometimes there is a limit to the amount of change I want in my life. I want the 23rd Psalm always to be in the KJV and the old songs I love to sing, I want them sung all the time. I look around and ask, "Why can't it be like I remember it being?" As, much as I love that question, it may not be the best question, if change is to bring a window of opportunity.

Then there was a little video of a guy dancing like he had fire ants biting him. The sun bathers on the hillside by the lake were ignoring him as best they could. Then one guy got up and danced with him. Now the nut dancing like a fool had a follower and that made him a leader. Then, others followed, like Arlo *Guthrie's Alice's Restaurant*. Not sure the lesson I was supposed to get, but.... All I need is to find a follower and I will no longer be a nut! So, I'll follow you if you will follow me and we will all follow Jesus and none of us will be nuts.

Prison Prayer Miracle

So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him. *Acts* 12:5

Nadia was in a prison in the Middle East for some months because she was a believer from Muslim background. She told the prison officials that she would not give them any information about the people she knew or about her husband, only about herself. This led her to being placed in an isolation cell for four days. The cell was small and extremely cold. There was no toilet or washing facilities at all.

"At one point," Nadia reported, "I was feeling very cold and found the whole experience tough. Suddenly though, I felt warm air blowing in my face. So warm, in fact, that when I breathed in and the air hit my lungs I had to cough."

She had no idea where the warmth was coming from and at the same time she became very joyful. This sense of joy overwhelmed her so much that she began to dance in the cell. Yet, at the same time, she also felt confused. *How could she feel warm and joyful in a cold prison cell,* she asked herself?

"Then I heard a voice," said Nadia. She emphasized that it wasn't an internal voice but audible, "as if someone in the cell was saying, 'That is because people are praying for you. This is the Spirit of happiness that has come upon you. Receive it."

Later on, after her release, Nadia shared her amazing experience in the cell with her sister. Asking when it had happened, Nadia's sister mentioned the same exact day and time when thirty-two believers had met to pray for Nadia and another believer in prison. Two of the participants had been appointed to represent Nadia and the other Christian. The remaining thirty believers gathered around them to ask God to comfort them, to fill them with joy and send His Spirit of happiness upon them." They were deeply encouraged to hear Nadia's experience.

Pastor Gambo Boka from northern Nigeria was falsely accused and sentenced by the Islamic court to three years of imprisonment. When he was put in prison, together with five other falsely accused Christians, he said, "God has a purpose in all of this. My soul is at rest." Though he lost weight and became weak, his faith became increasingly strong. He shared the gospel with many fellow prisoners, who were almost all Muslims. "I experience comfort in this terrible place." said Gambo. "I know that God's promises are true."

The Islamic court gave Pastor Gambo thirty days to appeal. While members of Pastor Gambo's church prayed, God performed a miracle. Gambo and the other five Christians were acquitted by an Islamic court because of a lack of evidence.

"This is God's grace," said one of the church members. "Our prayers have been heard and my faith has been strengthened. God's promises are so special!

"Pastor Gambo and the other five Christians left the court singing, thanking God for His intervention.


