Treasurer- The new checking account has been opened and all the funds have been realotted to the appropriate account. We added a Profit and Loss statement that shows all of the expenses and the income for each month, thus eliminating the huge spread sheet. We should have a very clear easy to read statement as of September! The budget allowance will remain in the bulletin each month. Finally, Cathy made a motion to pay for Terri to take a QuickBooks class at a cost of \$175. Mike 1st, Retha 2nd.

Pastor – The Assembly was held this month and Bishop Eaton was reelected to serve another 6 year term. Pastor Wiggin's initial contract is up at the end of this month and we (Salem Lutheran Church) ae going to renew it.

Proclaim – For Advent, we are giving to the Pregnancy Crisis Center. We would like to bring in their director to a church council. September 8th is "Homecoming Sunday" and we are having a potluck dinner. Tables will be set up in the Sunday school building with information about all the different ministries offered at Salem. Every member is encouraged to bring a friend! There will be a treasure hunt for the kids!

Nurture –Sunday school will not be called Sunday school anymore. We are looking for a new name for our new, fun and exciting curriculum No one person has to teach......

Response - Christmas Dinner Theater

Property -

- 1. The air conditioning unit in the Fellowship Hall has been replaced and is working fine.
- 2. The slow-draining sink in the Fellowship Hall was caused from a broken underground drain line. During repairs, the drain under the sink began leaking, heavy grease buildup was found in the kitchen drain lines and the urinal would not shut off. All of these were repaired and/or cleaned out.
- 3. We will be purchasing a portable sound system for use in the Fellowship Hall and as needed in other areas.
- 4. Lutheran Disaster Recovery / Long Term Recovery Group has asked if we would be willing to have one or more of our Sunday School rooms converted into bedrooms for volunteer workers coming to town to do repairs, build homes, etc., for victims of Harvey. Council voted to present all the details to the congregation for its approval at a special meeting on September 15th.

Old Business – Call Process Update – Council received and reviewed the profile.

New Business – Council reviewed in full the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) prepared by the Call Committee. This profile will be submitted to the synod bishop for review and posting on the ELCA website. Congregational Meeting September 15, 2019

The following was presented to council and council voted to present it to the congregation for consideration and approval at the September 15th meeting.

Lutheran Disaster Recovery / Long Term Recovery Group has asked if we would be willing to have one or more of our Sunday School rooms converted into bedrooms for volunteer workers coming to Port Lavaca to do repairs, build homes, etc., for victims of Harvey.

There will be 8 to 10 couples in their 50s, 60s and 70s. They are skilled workers...plumbers, electricians, carpenters and farmers. The couples are willing to pay a stipend for their rooms. The stipend will cover the increase in electrical and water/sewer usage, and any rent we may feel we should charge.

This will probably start October 1st lasting through May. They will do the room conversions, bring their own beds/bedding, and then convert the rooms back when they leave. They will need access to a kitchen for breakfast and dinner, and a place for devotions. They will bring in shower trailers that will need a water supply and access to the gray water sewer system (will need city approval). The shower trailers also need electricity. The workers have two tool trailers that will need to be parked for the entire time they are here. They have two vans that take the workers to and from the job sites as well as their personal vehicles.


Salem Lutheran Church has space for five couples and a place for one shower trailer, but they do not have space for the tool trailers. We also have a kitchen and a place for devotions (Fellowship Hall). The Presbyterian Church has space for a few other couples as well as parking for the tool trailers.

Things to consider:

- Storage of existing furnishings?
- Putting a toaster oven, microwave, refrigerator in Ed. Bldg. kitchen for use when the Fellowship Hall is not available?
- Will this affect our insurance coverage 24/7 occupancy? Retha is following up on this.

Note: Salem is currently leasing part of its education building to Lutheran Social Services for disaster relief casework. The Long Term Recovery Group is another branch of Lutheran Social Services.

JOY IN THE MORNING

Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

James 1:27

God's love compels us to feed the hungry, empower the poor, defend the weak and help those who are suffering. When we do these things, it includes encouraging and strengthening those persecuted for their faith in Christ. The church has often led the way in education and medical services in developing countries until governments or other local agencies take over.

Brother Andrew says that giving humanitarian aid is a picture of Jesus knocking at the door of our hearts (our lives) in Revelation Chapter Three. The doors of many hearts in the church are closed to acts of mercy and love in action. Therefore, Jesus stands knocking at the door of our hearts asking that we open that door and let Him in. His coming into our lives enables us to do acts of love.

"They killed my husband before my very own eyes. As if that wasn't enough, they destroyed everything by burning down our house including my dear husband's workshop." These were the words of Esther, the widow whose husband was killed by jihadists in Nigeria in January 2010.

For the mother of seven, life became unbearable. The house that her children called home no longer existed and the daunting absence of an income was an inevitable reality. To worsen their circumstances, the in-laws abandoned Esther and her children. Surrounded by walls of a room too small for eight people, depression threatened to overshadow her and Esther cried night and day, asking God for a way out.

She truly needed a shoulder to lean on. A friend told us her story and from there Open Doors provided financial support for this family. As a result, the family was able to move into an apartment in a Christian area, with enough room for everyone. The new home lent enough space for Esther to even start working from home. She is a tailor by profession and hopes to rent a shop in the near future.

Esther thought it wise to take some of the money and start a vegetable garden on a small scale. The idea is to feed her family and at the same time generate an income from it. She is confident that her vegetable business will grow to the point where she will be able to send the children to school.

"If Open Doors had not come to my aid," Esther concluded with tears, "what would have become of me and my children? For all I know, we all would have been dead, either by the hands of Jihadists or hunger. As for my husband's killers—though it's been difficult—through your prayers and encouragement I've been able to forgive them."


